Learning the alphabet is a basic skill children need to learn at an early age. Knowing the alphabet is the foundation of reading. Children that know the alphabet before entering kindergarten are better prepared, which gives them an academic advantage.

Goals

- Recognize letters
- Ability to recite the alphabet in order
- Differentiate between upper and lowercase letters
- Ability to choose similar letters from a group
- Ability to locate and match the correct upper and lowercase letter from a group
- Neatly trace both upper and lowercase letters
- · Ability to write upper and lowercase letters without tracing
- Ability to write upper and lowercase letters in order.
- · Know what letter comes before and after when not starting from beginning

Lesson Preparation

- Print and cut apart alphabet flashcards. Have the student help you.
- Print necessary worksheets for the days work
- Gather necessary materials for the lesson
- Schedule a time and write on calendar for daily study.

Set the Stage

- Play the "Alphabet Song" (track 2) several times. Sing along with the song. Listening to the song helps with letter sound recognition and aids in memorizing the letters in order.
- Show the student the worksheet or activity they will be doing.

Instruction

- Listen to the "Alphabet Song" prior to starting the lesson
- Review the letters on the alphabet printout
- Point to the letter as you say them out loud. Have student repeat after you.
- Work on learning I-3 letters at a time.
- Set aside 10-20 minutes for daily study
- Use flashcards and worksheets for practice
- Review worksheet instructions and expectations (i.e. will not rush, write neatly, etc.) at beginning of lesson.

Guided Practice

- Use flashcards for letter recognition
- Spread alphabet flashcards out on a table. Have child move them into the correct order.
- Print out 2 sets of flash cards and play the "memory game". Use 3-4 letters at a time.
- Mix up and Match the upper to the lowercase letters using the color yourself flashcards.

Independent Practice

- Have student trace the letters. Encourage neatness.
- Work on worksheets
- Have child color the upper and lowercase letters. Cut apart (assist with cutting as needed.)
- Print blank writing paper. Write the students name. Have child practice writing name.

Materials Needed

- Print outs
- Pencils, pens, crayons, or markers
- Scissors or paper cutter to make flash cards
- Music player of choice-Computer, iPod, or compact disc player to play song.






Open the folded book pages as shown.


Take # (2) pages and set on top of pages # (1). Take # (3) pages, set on top of # (2)



Fold all pages in half again.



- You can secure the books in several ways.
 - punch holes on yellow squares and secure with ribbon as shown left. I used 1/4-inch grossgrain ribbon with a rectangle hole punch.
 - · use double-sided tape down center of pages
 - Staple near yellow squares **Note:** Staples can be choking hazard for small children. Not recommended for children ages 4 and under.






